



Trends in Out of Home Care

Nationwide, the number of children in out of home care is declining.


Nationally, the decreasing number of children in out-of-home care has been driven by declining entries into care. However, this trend is starting to flatten out (or reverse in some states).

In Kansas, in order to meet the goal of a 50% reduction by 2020, the foster care population must be reduced by 8% per year.




Kansas In Care Population



Kansas Paths to Accomplishing 2020

Rate of Children Under 18 in Out-of-Home Care (per 1,000 children in population), FY10





National Child Poverty 2010: 21.6%





per 1,000 children under 18 in the population





Rate of Children Entering Care, FY10




Kansas – Reasons for Removal








Kansas Children (<18) Living in Poverty, 2010
