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
# KDADS Vision for Change



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

- Staff stationed in Topeka, Overland Park, McPherson, Kansas City, Salina and Wichita.
- Available to assist with referrals, questions regarding treatment, and concerns

- Total Number of BHS Funded Providers (Combination of Federal Block Grant, State General Funds and State Fee funds)-106 locations
- Total number of Medicaid Providers-179
- Total number of 3<sup>rd</sup> time DUI providers-89
- Total number of Methadone Providers-9
- Total number of Designated Women's programs-9



# SUD Treatment Data SFY 2015


Individuals receiving treatment

% Treated Inside / Outside Home Region










# Gambling Disorder Treatment FY2015


**Age Group**




**Gender**
