- (a) Licensee is an active participant on the case- planning team. **C NC**

 - (1) Identifying and sharing information, including any treatment outcomes achieved and the attainment of life skills. **C NC**

K.A.R. 28-4-811 Caregiver Qualifications; Supervision

- (a) Each caregiver is qualified by the temperament, emotional maturity, judgment, and the understanding of children necessary to maintain the health, comfort, safety, and welfare of children in foster care. **C NC**
- (b) Licensee ensures that each child in foster care is supervised in accordance with the child's age, maturity, risk factors, and developmental level. **C NC**
Additional supervision is provided when:
 - (1) The child has mental health issues related to risk-taking behaviors. **C NC**
 - (2) The child would be a danger to self or others. **C NC**
 - (3) The child functions below the child's chronological age level. **C NC**
 - (4) The child is unable to engage in self-care. **C NC**
- (c) Licensee ensures substitute care and supervision when:
 - (1) The licensee is absent between the hours of 6:00 am and midnight, and: **C NC**
 - (A) The absence is less than four hours, the substitute is at **C NC**

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- least 14 years of age AND at least 3 years older than the oldest child in foster care.
- (B) The absence is from four to ten hours, the substitute caregiver is at least 16 years of age AND at least 3 years older than the oldest child in foster care. **C NC**
- (2) The licensee is absent for more than 10 hours OR for any period between midnight and 6:00 am, the substitute caregiver is at least 18 years of age AND at least three years older than the oldest child in foster care. **C NC**
- (d) A child in foster care who is at least 12 years of age is permitted to stay at home without adult supervision between the hours of 6:00 am and midnight only if:
 - (1) The potential for self-care is identified and written approval is included in the child's case plan. **C NC**
 - (2) Each child's specific risk-factors are considered in developing the self-care plan. **C NC**
 - (3) The licensee has a written self-care plan for each child in foster care in the home in the absence of the licensee. Self-care plan is approved by the sponsoring CPA and the child's child-placing agent. **C NC**
 - (4) Only children residing in the home are present during self-care. **C NC**
 - (5) Minimum age and maximum time limits are followed:
 - (A) Child at least 12 years of age – maximum two consecutive hours; no more than four hours each day. **C NC**
 - (B) Child at least 14 years of age – maximum four hours each day. **C NC**
 - (C) Child at least 16 years of age – maximum 10 hours each day. **C NC**

K.A.R. 28-4-812 Respite Care

 - (1) The respite care provider is in compliance with all FFH Regulations. **C NC N/A**

K.A.R. 28-4-814 Family Life

 - (1) Inclusion of the child in the daily life of the family, including eating meals with the family and participating in recreational activities. **C NC**
 - (2) Ensuring that each child is provided with the same opportunities that are provided to other children residing in the home. **C NC**
 - (3) Ensuring that each child is provided access to schools, church, recreational and health facilities and other community resources. **C NC**

 - (d) Licensee provides an allowance to each child in foster care equal to that of any other children of similar age in the FFH who receive an allowance. **C NC**
 - (e) Each child in foster care has the opportunity to earn spending money at tasks or jobs.
 - Money earned belongs to the child. **C NC**
 - The child is not forced to provide for needs that otherwise would be provided by the licensee. **C NC**
 - (f) Licensee permits each child in foster care to perform only tasks that are within the child's ability, are reasonable, and are similar to expectations for others in the household. **C NC**
 - (g) Extended family members identified as resources for informal visitation.
 - (1) Licensee meets the following requirements for each:
