



NORTHEAST REGION

REGIONAL DIRECTOR: CAROLINE HASTINGS



- **HB2075 Implementation:** We have two temporary staff who are the primary responders on weekends, with our other staff on a stand-by rotation to help if needed.
- Regional Prevention Strengths:
 - Northeast has had 24% decrease in out of home foster care from Nov. 2021 to July 2025.
 - Initial placement with relatives up to 50.38%.
 - Recurrent maltreatment numbers is at 2%.
 - After a child is determined to be a victim of abuse or neglect, only 2% had a subsequent substantiated finding within 12 months.
- **Regional Highlight:** For our child protection field staff, we only have 2 vacancies and have been able to do very well with retention.



- HB 2075 Implementation: Partners have been receptive and engaged in conversations.
- Regional Prevention Strengths:
 - Four Questions & Bridging the Gap presentations.
 - Targeted work with Grantees & Contractors: TDM Pilot
- Regional Highlight:
 - Legal trainings with court partners and DCF, SFM and TFI
 - Strategic work with hospital systems surrounding prevention for most vulnerable population using shared understandings of "Immediate Safety", "Risk", "Neglect", and "Poverty."

- **HB 2075 Implementation:** The Kansas City Region CPS Leadership Team and Practitioners are working diligently to connect with law enforcement agencies in the region to build relationships and establish lines of communication during weekends and holidays.

- Regional Prevention Strengths:

- Reduction in the need for Foster Care Out of Home (OOH) placements are below 1,000 for the first time in over 14 years.
- Working with DCCCA to train the region on Risk, Danger, and Safety.

• Regional Highlight(s):

- Connecting Families Community Forums we host for our 5 counties each year.
- Concentrated Foster Care Prevention Connecting with PRTFs/ Acutes to not place kids in PPC and instead to engage DCF who bring alongside DCCCA to help determine ways to support these families.

• **HB 2075 Implementation:** Regional staff met with local Law Enforcement partners and implementation is going well


Regional Prevention Strengths:

• Regional Highlight: The Southwest Region has incredible staff!






NUMBER OF CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE




CHILDREN ENTERING & EXITING FOSTER CARE ACROSS YEARS

HOUSE BILL 2075 IMPLEMENTATION

- On July 1, 2025, DCF began initiating contact with families every day of the week including Saturdays, Sundays and holidays when there is a report from a law enforcement officer about a child in a family who might be a victim of abuse or neglect.
- DCF now responds within 24 hours by initiating contact of individuals named and responding back to the referring law enforcement agency.
- The reports received have been a mix of reports from officers and police department records departments. Regional staff received positive comments from local law enforcement.
 - July 1st 20th 444 total reports were received from Law Enforcement

CCWIS CONTRACT AWARDS



CONTRACTS ANNOUNCED ON JULY 22, 2025

The CCWIS project will modernize DCF's child welfare information systems and develop interfaces between the various agencies serving DCF's Prevention and Protection Services (PPS) and Adult Protective Services (APS) programs.
