The Law Regarding KDWP Restrictions

Federal law requires states to take action when child support goes unpaid. In Kansas, falling behind on your child support obligation could make you subject to restrictions.

This policy helps ensure families get the support they need, while keeping Kansas in compliance with federal and state regulations.

License Denial

Under Kansas law, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) shall not issue recreational licenses and permits to those with child support arrears exceeding \$500 and payments 90 days past due.

The restriction applies to:

- ✦ Hunting licenses, permits, stamps and tags
- ✦ Fishing licenses and permits
- ✦ Furharvester licenses
- ✦ Boat and vessel registrations
- ✦ State Park permits and camping fees



Reinstatement

To reinstate your license, contact Kansas Child Support Services (CSS) to discuss your case with a child support specialist.

If you are employed, you will be asked to provide active employment information to facilitate the issuance of an Income Withholding Order (IWO).

For those who are unemployed or self-employed, call CSS to establish a monthly repayment agreement.

Stay Current, Stay Eligible

If your child support payments are not current, the delinquency is reported to the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP).

Make consistent and timely payments on court-ordered child support, to avoid delinquency and potential restrictions.

Payments can be made in a variety of ways through the Kansas Payment Center (KPC).
