



License Restriction Information

Federal Law

Federal law requires states to take action when child support goes unpaid. In Kansas, falling behind on your child support obligation could make you subject to restrictions.

This policy helps ensure families get the support they need while keeping Kansas Child Support Services (CSS) in compliance with federal and state regulations.

Stay Current, Stay Eligible

If CSS identifies your case as 90 days past due and owing more than \$500, the status will be reported to the license-issuing agency.

Reinstatement

To reinstate your license, contact CSS to discuss your case with a child support specialist.

If you are employed, you will be asked to provide verification of employment to facilitate the issuance of an Income Withholding Order (IWO).

Those who are unemployed or self-employed should contact CSS to establish a monthly repayment agreement.

How to Appeal

If you believe your child support payments are up to date, contact CSS and request an official review of your case.

If you disagree with the information provided, you may request an administrative hearing by sending a written request to:
