Dental			Any member ages 21 and over are eligible for added dental benefits for specialty services not covered under KanCare, up to \$500 per year.
Vision / Mobile Clinics		On a quarterly basis, Sunflower will provide Members access to dental and vision care via a mobile clinic for Members residing in rural communities. Sunflower will identify locations and coordinate appointments for Members to access dental screenings, vision screenings and prescription glasses; and to schedule follow up appointments as needed.	Adult members (age 21 an over) can get an additional \$60 once a year, to upgrade their frames.
